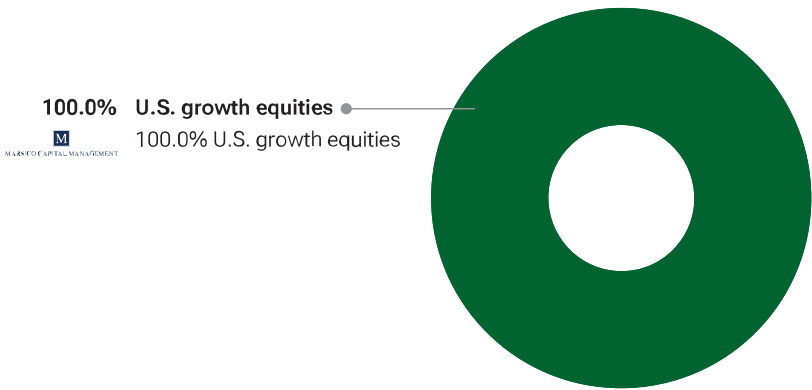

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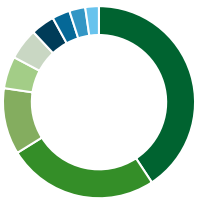
How the fund is invested² as at May 31, 2025

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Q2 2025 Fund Commentary

Market Commentary

U.S. equities rose over the second quarter of 2025, despite falling sharply after the U.S. administration's tariff announcements in early April. Equities rebounded because of a 90-day tariff pause, strong corporate earnings, easing inflation and growing optimism around potential interest-rate cuts.

Many publicly traded U.S. companies reported better-than-expected results, reinforcing investor confidence in corporate profitability. Major technology firms, such as NVIDIA Corp. and Meta Platforms Inc., posted strong earnings and positive outlooks.

Data related to consumer sentiment and employment was mixed. The Conference Board Consumer Confidence Index, based on consumers' short-term outlook on income, business and labour conditions, fell in June. The U.S. unemployment rate held steady at 4.2% in April and May, but businesses delayed hiring and investment due to tariff uncertainty. As a result, the U.S. labour market remained resilient but appeared to be cooling.

The U.S. Federal Reserve Board (Fed) kept the federal funds rate unchanged as it monitored the impact of tariffs. Some Fed officials acknowledged that tariff-induced costs were contributing to higher inflation, but many viewed this as temporary rather than a long-term trend.

Performance

The Fund's relative exposure to Microsoft Corp., NVIDIA and Netflix Inc. was positive for performance. Microsoft posted better-than-expected earnings because of the rapid adoption of its tools powered by artificial intelligence (AI). NVIDIA reported strong earnings, recording record data-centre revenue, because of demand for AI infrastructure. Netflix benefited from investor enthusiasm around its content slate and reduced competitive pressure.

Relative exposure to Apple Inc., The Goldman Sachs Group Inc. was negative for performance. Apple faced strategic and regulatory challenges that weighed on investor sentiment, including a lack of clarity around its AI strategy. Goldman Sachs was affected by U.S. tariffs, as it has exposure to capital markets and investment banking activity.

At the sector level, stock selection in industrials and communication services was positive for the Fund's performance. Overweight exposure to communication services and underweight exposure to health care were also positive. Stock selection in and overweight exposure to financials and materials was negative for performance, as was underweight exposure to information technology.

Portfolio Activity

The sub-advisor added Danaher Corp. to the Fund based on its leadership in life sciences and diagnostics. The sub-advisor believes the company's diversified portfolio of essential tools and instruments offers durability through economic cycles. The Progressive Corp. was added because of its strategic investments in technology and marketing, which are driving improvements in its claims process and customer engagement. Booking Holdings Inc. was added to gain exposure to the travel recovery trend, supported by the ongoing shift to digital and mobile-first travel planning.

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Holdings in TKO Group Holdings Inc., NVIDIA and JPMorgan Chase & Co. were increased. The sub-advisor believes TKO Group should benefit from the global demand for live combat sports, coupled with growing media rights opportunities and sponsorships. NVIDIA is expected to benefit from rising demand for its products in the build-out of global AI infrastructure. JPMorgan should benefit from an improving economic outlook and resilient U.S. consumer environment, in the sub-advisor's view.

Alphabet Inc. was sold because of growing concerns around competitive intensity in search engines. Goldman Sachs was sold amid uncertainty stemming from recent tariff announcements under the U.S. administration. Starbucks Corp. was sold because of concerns around its international growth trajectory and rising geopolitical risk.

Amazon.com Inc. was reduced as the sub-advisor believes higher investments in Amazon Web Services infrastructure and retail logistics could put pressure on near-term profit growth. A holding in Apple was trimmed because of increased competition in China and a slower iPhone upgrade cycle.

Outlook

The sub-advisor maintains a cautiously optimistic outlook based on the shifting geopolitical landscape. In late June, there were reports suggesting the U.S. and China had agreed to a framework for a trade deal. If confirmed, the sub-advisor believes clearer trade agreements could boost investor confidence.

While the U.S. labour market remains resilient, it has shown signs of slowing, in the sub-advisor's view. The sub-advisor believes that if the labour market continues to cool, the Fed may cut interest rates in the near term.
